



Fine Arts Faculty and Staff Biographies

CHRISTOPHER MARTIN is currently the K-12 Fine Arts Director for the Westborough Public Schools. Christopher holds a Master's Degree in Music Education (magna cum laude) and a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education and Vocal Performance (cum laude) from Ithaca College. He also received his administrative licensure through Boston University and the Education Cooperative. In addition to being the Director of Fine Arts, Christopher is also the Artistic Director of the Neponset Choral Society, a 60 member, auditioned choir based out of Foxboro, MA.

Prior to his position in Westborough, Christopher spent

nine years as a choral director in the Norwood Public Schools where his responsibilities included teaching 450 young musicians within five curricular choruses, as well as an auditioned Honor Chorus, Women's Chorus and Men's Chorus. His ensembles had the honor of receiving high ratings at both the MICCA and Great East Festivals. Christopher was previously a faculty member of the Handel & Haydn Society's Vocal Apprenticeship Program, where he taught music theory and ear training to students in grades 4-12. As a soloist, Christopher has performed with the Mystic Chorale under the direction of Nick Page, and the Neponset Choral Society, under the direction of Michael Turner.

Christopher is an active member of the American Choral Director's Association and the National Association for Music Education, as well as the Massachusetts' Music Educator's Association where he served as the All-State Chorus Manager from 2009-2011, Concert Manager for the All-State Conference from 2013-2015, and the Chorus Manager for the Central District MMEA Senior Festival from 2015-2017. Christopher is also a member of the Massachusetts Instrumental and Choral Conductors' Association (MICCA) executive board, serving as the Administrative Representative and Choral Festival Chairperson, and serves as the K-12 Administrative Representative for the MMEA executive board.

EMMA BALLACHINO is beginning her second year as 3D Art Teacher at Westborough High School. In the classroom, she emphasizes the importance of material exploration and a willingness to make mistakes. Along with teaching technical skill and multiple approaches to 3D art making, Emma works hard to create a space in which students feel safe to explore and grow as artists

Emma graduated with a BFA from Massachusetts College of Art and design and is currently working towards her M.Ed

at Framingham State University. At the High School, Emma teaches 3D Foundations, Sculpture, AP 3D Studio Art, Pottery I, II, III, and IV, and Modernism. She is excited to form connections and build relationships within the schools and town of Westborough and looks forward to showcasing student artwork throughout the community.

BECKY CONNOR BURGOYNE has taught visual art in the Westborough Public Schools for the past 16 years. She teaches at Gibbons Middle School, where she focuses on providing a well-rounded visual art experience for seventh- and eighth-



grade students. Class offerings traditionally include drawing, painting, art history, ceramics and other sculpture forms. The Art Club, Sculpture Club and Anime Club offer additional time after school for students to pursue their artistic interests.

Mrs. Burgoyne has completed coursework from Worcester State University, Fitchburg State University, Worcester Center for Crafts and Worcester Art Museum; concentrating in drawing, sculpture and non-Western art history. She holds a B.A. and M.Ed. from Framingham State University. With a focus on drawing and three-dimensional sculpture, Mrs. Burgoyne's artwork has been exhibited in a number of local venues. She lives in Millbury with her husband, Andy, and their twins, Connor and Avery.

KRISTIN CHARTIER began teaching orchestra in Westborough, MA in 2010. Her teaching responsibilities include directing the Westborough High School Orchestras, WHS String Chamber Ensemble, WHS Honors String Quartet, the Gibbons Middle School Orchestra, and the Gibbons Middle School String Chamber Ensemble. Before coming to Westborough, she taught middle school and high school orchestra in Chelmsford, MA from 2004 to 2010. Under her direction, Ms. Chartier's orchestras have consistently earned high ratings at state adjudicated festivals.

Ms. Chartier completed her Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, in 2004 and earned a Master of Music in Music Education from the University of Massachusetts at Lowell in 2010.

A violinist, Ms. Chartier plays regularly with Symphony Pro Musica, a local community orchestra. She is currently a member of the American String Teachers Association (ASTA) and the National Association for Music Education (NAfME). Ms. Chartier lives in Northborough, MA with her husband, James, and two children, Alexander and William.

THERESA CLEARY Theresa Cleary is in her third year as director of the 6th Grade Orchestra at the Mill Pond School, in addition to teaching general music classes and coteaching 4th and 5th grade strings with Valerie Clemans-Castilla and Judy Gerratt. She holds a Bachelor's Degree in viola performance from UMass Lowell (magna cum laude) and is currently working on her Master's of Music Education at Gordon College. Prior to teaching in Westborough, Ms. Cleary taught strings in the Fall River Public Schools, outreach programs including the UMass Lowell String Project and Up With Music, and privately in programs with the

Chelmsford and Milton Public Schools. She has adjudicated for the Junior and Senior SEMSBA Festivals and various student solo competitions. She currently maintains a private lesson studio in Ipswich, is Master Teacher of the UMass Lowell String Project, and is a chamber coach and adjudicator for the Northeast Massachusetts Youth Orchestras.

Outside of the classroom, Ms. Cleary is an active freelancer and has performed for and participated in masterclasses with Jeanne Bamberger, the Harlem String Quartet, and the Borromeo String Quartet. Ms. Cleary performs with multiple orchestras and theater companies all over New England. She is currently principal violist for the New Hampshire Philharmonic as well as a member of Symphony Pro Musica and a substitute violist for the Cape Ann Symphony. Students studying dance in Westborough are exposed to a wide variety of styles. Beginning in General Music, students in grades K-6 learn and perform folk dances from around the world and showcase these dances each Spring. After elementary school,

> students can choose to participate in the WHS Dance Ensemble, Gibbons and WHS theatrical productions as part of the dance ensemble, or even the colorguard as a member of the Ranger Marching Band.

Visual arts classes allow students to draw, paint, and sculpt using a variety of media and techniques such as pencil, oil, watercolor, ceramics, and photography and computer design. An array of 2D and 3D courses are available at the high school, and young artists are frequently showcased in local and national exhibitions.

Students also may join the Pottery Club, Open Studio and Photography Club; and middle school pupils may participate in Art Club or Sculpture Club in addition to their curricular art classes.

He has been a Fine Arts / Music Department faculty member in Westborough since 1989. Prior teaching positions included East Boston, Newton, Malden, Duxbury, Wellesley, and Dedham public school systems.

As a performer, he has been a recognized "Yamaha" Band Instrument Co. Trumpet Artist since 1988. He is currently a free-lance performer with local groups such as The Fantasy Big Band and the Worcester Jazz Orchestra, directed by Mr. Eric French. Past performance and recording credits include: Jordan Valentine & The Sunday Saints, A Decade of Soul, Quintessential Brass, Bobby Rydell, The Four Tops, Jacques D'Amboise and the National Dance Institute, Harvard University's (Hasty Pudding Theatrical Society) and his own Spectrum Jazz Quintet.
